Math  • Division problem: For every 50 eggs laid by a mother frog only 1 will end up hatching
How many eggs will hatch if a frog lays 500 eggs?
<ul> <li>Pie chart activity to tie in with science: Create a pie chart to conceptualize and</li> </ul>
breakdown the stages of a frog's life.
<b>Grade Level Modifications:</b> Division problem numbers can be reduced if necessary. Bring out manipulative
like 10s blocks to help.
• Compare and contrast the life cycle of a frog and a dog. Explore survival techniques I
hibernation.
<b>Grade Level Modifications:</b> Focus on the life cycle of the frog. Draw what they would look like in each of
life stages.
Social Studies   • Lesson on domestication of wolves and the evolution into modern-day dogs. Explore
compare the relationship of dogs and humans in the past in different civilizations.
(example could be the Siberian Husky- this can be extended to FPPL as the Inuit have
used dogs to pull sleds for thousands of years!)
<b>Grade Level Modifications:</b> Concept of domestication could be a stretch for some. Instead, could researc
dog breed of their choice and explore what they were bred for.
• Animal relay race! Break kids into groups of 3-4. Each group is assigned an animal-gi
2-3 minutes to come up with a movement for said animal. Relay race will have 4-5 different animal movements.
<b>Grade Level Modifications:</b> Instead of a race, could do an obstacle course- warm up/round 1 could be
walking through the course. Hop like a frog for round 2, and walk on all fours like a dog round 3.
• Idea #1: Paint a landscape in four different seasons. Would be on a single piece of pa
broken into four quadrants. What animals might you find outside in each of the
seasons?
<ul> <li>Idea #2: Animals tend to symbolize different things in various indigenous cultures.</li> </ul>
Explore and create a poster of a frog or a dog/wolf and what it symbolizes for a given
culture.
